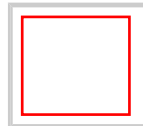

2004 CTA Scholarship for Members

Applications for the 2004 CTA Scholarship for Members are being accepted now; five (5) \$2,000.00 scholarships will be awarded. To be eligible and considered by the CTA Scholarship Committee:

- Chapter Presidents must sign the Membership Verification Form.
- The application must be complete.
- Applications must be postmarked by February 16, 2004

2004 CTA Scholarship for Dependent Children

2004 CTA César E. Chávez Memorial Education Awards Program

This program is designed to provide recognition for teams of students and teachers who demonstrate an understanding of the vision and guiding principles by which César E. Chávez lived his life. The Awards Program will honor the memory of this great man and ensure that the spirit of his work continues in the classrooms of California. The 40 top prize winners will receive recognition plus a \$500 savings bond for the students and \$500 for the CTA member. High school seniors and community college students will receive \$500 cash in lieu of a savings bond. Group entries will share the award. For the current school year, eligible projects must fit into the category of either Written Essays or Visual Arts.

To be eligible and considered by the CTA César E. Chávez Memorial Education Awards Program:

- You must be a CTA member and submit a project with (1) student or a group of no more than five (5) students (K-Community College).
- The CTA member must be employed at the same school or campus as the student is enrolled.
- The application form must be complete.
- Applications and projects must be received by April 1, 2004.
